### 3. Becoming. Architectures for a planet in transition

In July 2021, the XXXIII UIA General Assembly elected Barcelona (Spain) to host the 2026 UIA World Congress of Architects.

A two-stage international competition was launched to select the General Commissioners of the Barcelona Congress. The winning team has developed the theme "Becoming. Architectures for a planet in transition", which will analyse the capacity of architecture to transform reality in time.

The theme will branch into six lines of research, curated by both the commissioners and an extensive and international group of invited collaborators; their conclusions will be presented throughout the Congress:

- Becoming beyond-human
- Becoming attuned
- Becoming embodied
- Becoming interdependent
- Becoming hyper-conscious
- Becoming circular

# 4. Barcelona: World Capital of Architecture 2026

The UNESCO-UIA World Capital of Architecture label is recognised globally and is an acknowledgment that the city has always encouraged an approach to architectural production with values and efforts that are advocated by UNESCO and the UIA.

Every three years, UNESCO designates the host cities of the UIA's World Congresses as World Capitals of Architecture.



The city of Barcelona has been officially designated as World Capital of Architecture for 2026 by the Director-General of UNESCO, Audrey Azoulay. The designation was made on the recommendation of the Joint UNESCO-UIA Committee for the World Capital of Architecture that is presided by Architect Dominique Perrault.

"We are pleased to see the baton of the World Capital of Architecture title pass onto Barcelona for 2026. Barcelona will continue to elaborate on Copenhagen's accomplishments – by conveying the way in which architecture and culture can respond to today's challenges for the global public good and future generations," said Audrey Azoulay.

In cooperation with the Consejo Superior de los Colegios de Arquitectos de España (CSCAE) and the Colegio Oficial de Arquitectos de Cataluña (COAC), the Municipality of Barcelona will facilitate a comprehensive programme of events, exhibitions, activities and ventures that clearly demonstrate and emphasise the value and importance of the contribution of architecture and urban design for the sustainable development of the City of Barcelona.
